Congestion At The Top

Lower Bucks May Have Four-Way Tie For First

This should be one of the most exciting weeks of the Lower Bucks League football campaign.

Four teams are in close contention for top honors in the league and neither will give an inch as they go down the home stretch. All of them will see action this weekend.

Delhaas will invade Newtown to meet the Indians of Council Rock. Pennsbury will play host to the visiting Bensalem Owls. William Tennent will journey to Bristol, and Morrisville will meet Neshaminy in a battle for first place.

Let's take a look into the crystal ball and see what we come up with for the weekend's games. The record to date is 5-2-1.

COUNCIL ROCK-DELHAAS. A fired-up Delhaas eleven battled Bristol last weekend to a 13-13 standstill while a much improved Council Rock ballclub gave Neshaminy a good fight but went down in defeat 27-12. Dale Miller, the quiet mentor of the CR Indians, will have his squad whipped into shape for this one in hopes that his boys can annex their first contest of the campaign.

BOTH WINLESS. Delhaas is also without a win in the conference this year, losing three and tying one. They also will be up for this one.

CR will rely a lot on ace halfback Clyde Beagle both on offense and defense while Delhaas has a fine backfield and an outstanding end in Barry Turk. The game will be played on the Indians' gridiron on Saturday at 2 p.m.

The outcome - have a hunch Delhaas will prevail 20-13.

MORRISVILLE - NESHAMINY. This should be the top tilt of the weekend and the outcome could throw the league into a four-way tie for first place. Morrisville has a 4-0 slate in the league, making Bensalem their fourth victim last week 13-6, while Neshaminy has

won three and dropped one in the league this year, that being to Pennsbury 7-6.

The defending league champs will have a battle on their hands with Gordon Davies' Bulldogs. Morrisville has about the best offense in the league as well as the two leading scorers in Jeff Foster and Bob Hart.

EXCELLENT OFFENSE. The Redskins also have a good offense and two fine backs in Tom Stricker and Jerry Mladjen, and with Al Gaskill and quarterback Rich Simon completing the quartet the Bulldogs will have a hardtime trying to stop them.

Morrisville hasn't won the Lower Bucks flag in fourteen years while Neshaminy is the defending champ.

Both teams will be up for this one and the contest will be played Saturday afternoon on the R. J. Bert Morris Field in Morrisville at 2 p.m. It should be a real good ball game and Neshaminy might be a slight favorite but I'll go along with an upset and stick with the Bulldogs 14-13.

WILLIAM TENNENT - BRISTOL. The Panthers under Jim Exum stunned Lower Bucks fans last week by upsetting the league leading Pennsbury Falcons 12-8. This victory put the Panthers in a three-way tie for second place with Neshaminy and Pennsbury.

TENNENT FAVORED. Fred Prender's Bristol Warriors have only one victory in league play this year, that being over Bensalem. And last week the warriors battled Delhaas to a 13-13 draw. The Bristol eleven has a good passing attack and quarterback Fred Williamson will probably throw quite a few aerials throughout the ball game.

Tennent's quarterback George David played a beautiful ball game for the Panthers last week, mixing up his plays and completely baffling the visiting Falcons.

WT will operate without the services of its ace fullback Bud Martini, who is lost for the season due to a leg injury. This might be a break for the Warriors.

They should be a good contest but I think the fired-up Panthers will be too strong for Bristol. The choice, therefore, is Tennent 20-6.

PENNSBURY - BENSLEM. The Falcons will be ready for this one and with a few breaks a victory over the visiting Bensalem Owls could put them into a tie with Tennent in one of the league's biggest surprises 12-8, while Bensalem bowed to the Morrisville Bulldogs 13-6.

Pennsbury has about the best team in the loop defensively and two good backs in Allen "Duke" Snyder and John Horn. Bensalem is laden down with injuries, especially at quarterback. All three of its QB's are injured and head coach Bob Rhiel will have to come up with something for the contest.

Game will be played Friday night at 8:15 at Morrisville. The injury problem will hurt Bensalem and it will have to dig deep to pull this one out. The Falcons should be in good shape and eager to bounce back into the win column.

Williams Follows In Third

NEW YORK (UP) - Unbeaten Amherst took over the lead today in the balloting for the first Annual Lambert Cup, emblematic of Eastern small college football supremacy.

The Lord Jeffs moved to the top with a rating of 9.8 points in the voting by coaches and sports writers as Lehigh, which had been leading through most of the season, dropped to second place at 9.0 points after suffering its first loss of the season at the hands of VMI.

Wins Seven Amherst has won all its seven games, rolling up 284 points to only 40 for its rivals, who have scored only two touchdowns.

Williams was third in the voting with 7.5 points, followed by Tufts with 6.0, Gettysburg with 5.6, Juniata with 3.0, Deaware with 2.5, and West Chester with 2.2. Also receiving mention were Connecticut, Springfield, Lafayette, and Corland.

Lafayette Girds For W. Maryland

Lafayette and Western Maryland will meet here Saturday for the fifth time in a football series that began in 1940. Lafayette has won all four games played in the series.

Steve Hokuf, looking ahead to the traditional game with Lehigh in Nov. 23, hopes to rest some of his regulars tomorrow and to use sophomores as much as possible.

Lafayette enters the game with a 3 and 3 record. Western Maryland's record is 4-1-1.
